

**TOWN OF WHITE CITY
BYLAW NO. 414-04**

**A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF WHITE CITY IN THE PROVINCE OF
SASKATCHEWAN PROHIBITING THE DISCHARGE OF GUNS OR
ANY OTHER FIREARM WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF
WHITE CITY**

The Council of the Town of White City in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. That no person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any gun or other firearm within the limits of the Town of White City.
2. That no person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any type of air gun and/or spring gun, sling shot or crossbow or any type of bow that would cause ammunition or any object or objects to be projected a distance of more than twenty-five (25) feet within the limits of the Town of White City, without express written permission from the Town of White City.
3. The provisions of Section 1 do not apply to a person who is:
 - a) A police officer in performance of his or her duties;
 - b) A registered member of a gun club or similar organization while engaged in target practice at a recognized range;
 - c) A person designated as a pest control officer;
 - d) Any person authorized by the Council of the municipality.
4. Any person who contravenes any provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offense and liable on summary conviction:
 - a) for the first offense, a fine of not less than Fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty(30) days;
 - b) for the second and any subsequent offense, a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00 and not more than One Thousand Dollars(\$1,000.00) and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term of not less than five (5) days and not more than thirty(30) days;
 - c) where damage is done to property by an unlawful act under this Bylaw, the presiding Justice of the Magistrate's Court or the Justice of the Peace may adjudge payment of all damages occasioned by the unlawful act and the same shall be applied for the reparation and reconstruction of the property damaged or destroyed.

5. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of final passing.
6. That Bylaw No. 98-88 is hereby repealed.
