Re: Partnership Agreement with Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure  
For Highway No.1 Corridor Study

## **Background**

In October 2009, the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure engaged the services of a consultant, AECOM, to complete an update to the long term functional plan for the Highway No. 1 corridor between Balgonie and Regina. The update, or study, is in partnership with Pilot Butte, Balgonie, White City and the RM of Edenwold and involves guiding and directing the consultant including sharing a portion of the study cost. Each municipality has agreed to contribute \$5,000 for the study which is estimated at \$170,000. The remainder of the study cost would be the responsibility of the Ministry.

The purpose of this report is to seek Council approval to enter into an agreement, attached hereto as Appendix "A", with the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure to fund the study in partnership with the Ministry and member municipalities.

## **Discussion**

The Highway No. 1 East Functional Planning Study is important to the Town of White City's social, economic and environmental well being. Safe access and movement of traffic along the Trans Canada Highway corridor is quickly becoming the most significant concern registered by White City and Emerald Park residents. Town Council recognizes how important this issue is to residents and have committed to participating in the study. The additional \$5,000 funding provided by each of the participating municipalities will ensure the scope of the study includes key issues. For example, the study will focus on the Highway No. 1 access points including:

- Highway No. 10
- Balgonie Access
- Highway No. 46
- Highway No. 48
- White City Access
- Emerald Park Access

- Great Plains Access
- Pilot Butte Access
- Gravel Pit Road
- Tower Road

### **Budget Implications**

The \$5,000 contribution to the Functional Planning Study would be funded out of the Consulting Fees account within the 2010 Budget. The Administration will ensure there are sufficient funds allocated for this purpose.

### **Conclusion**

The Highway No. 1 East Functional Planning Study is important to the long term growth and development of White City. Safe access and vehicle movement along the Trans Canada Highway are emerging as a significant issue for town residents. Council recognizes the importance of this study and has committed to participate as a member of the Steering Committee and funding the study in the amount of \$5,000.

### **Recommendation**

Your Administration recommends that:

1. Council enters into an agreement with the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure to cost share the Highway No.1 East Functional Planning Study in the amount of \$5,000.

Re: Wastewater Management Authority – Establishment of a Line of Credit

## **Background**

The Town of White City and the RM of Edenwold entered into an agreement to establish a Public Utility Board known as the Wastewater Management Authority. The objectives of the Authority as established under *Bylaw No. 535-10* are to:

- Plan, implement and operate an integrated wastewater management system serving the Authority's members with an environmentally appropriate wastewater management service at a reasonable cost; and
- Dispose of wastewater in a manner that will protect public health and safety, and the environment.

The Authority is working on a long term wastewater management strategy for White City and Emerald Park aimed at resolving capacity issues with the current wastewater systems in both municipalities. The Authority is working on a wastewater project which consists of several sub elements which includes:

1. **Force Main, Gravity Main and Lift Station** – this is represented by the construction of a pipe line and a midpoint lift station to divert treated effluent from the RM lagoons to the White City lagoons;
2. **Sustainability and Irrigability Study of White City Lagoon** – this represents an assessment of the current White City lagoons to determine their functionality from an environmental and structural perspective. The assessment also includes an evaluation of the pivot site;
3. **Flow Monitoring** – this represents the installation of a wastewater flow measurement device on the lagoon inlet. This is necessary to properly assess the sustainability function of the White City lagoon and determine capacity requirements;
4. **Short Term Upgrade of Existing Wastewater Facilities** – this represents the design and development of a short term solution (5-7

years) that may be required to add wastewater capacity for the RM and the Town while a longer term wastewater management solution is being developed; and

5. **Wastewater Treatment Plant and Disposal** – this represents the design and development of a long term solution to the wastewater management challenges for the town and the RM.

To fully engage and implement the various components of the wastewater project requires financial resources. The purpose of this report is to seek Council's support for the Authority's application through a financial institution for a line of credit in the amount of 2 million dollars.

### **Discussion**

The Wastewater Management Authority has been established pursuant to Section 33 of the *Municipalities Act, 2007*. The Act establishes the authority of a Public Utility Board including guidelines for borrowing as specified in Section 34(1) which states, "A public utility board may borrow any moneys that the public utility considers necessary to meet its expenditures."

The Authority is requesting a motion of support from the Council's of the member municipalities to secure a line of credit in the amount of 2 million dollars. The funds are required to fund those wastewater sub elements listed in elements 1 to 4 inclusive. A line of credit would serve the immediate financial requirements for the Authority. A longer term borrowing strategy would be formulated by the Authority over the next few months in consultation with the respective municipal councils.

### **Budget Implications**

There are no budget implications associated with this request. The financial costs associated with the line of credit would be the responsibility of the Authority. There may be budget implications associated with a longer term borrowing strategy which would form part of a future report.

### **Conclusion**

The Wastewater Management Authority has requested a motion of support from each participating municipality for a 2 million dollar line of credit. The funds are required as a bridge until a longer term financing strategy is formulated. The 2 million dollars would be sufficient to complete the Force Main, Gravity Main and Lift Station and a portion of the Short Term Upgrade of Existing Wastewater Facilities of the wastewater project.

The Administration proposes that Council provide the necessary support for the Authority to secure the line of credit.

**Recommendation**

Your Administration recommends that:

1. Council approves the Wastewater Management Authority's application for a 2 million dollar line of credit through a financial institution of the Authority's choice.

Re: Request to Waive Fees – Library Board Fundraiser

### **Background**

In an e-mail dated January 10, 2010, the White City Library Board requested a waiver of Community Centre fees so they could host an event to raise funds for the Library.

The purpose of this report is to seek Council approval to support the White City Library Board fundraising efforts.

### **Discussion**

The White City Library Board operates under the auspices of White City Town Council. The board is managed and operated by volunteers although the Town provides the facilities, additional hours for the librarian and an annual operating budget.

The Library Board had great success with this fundraiser last year and is hosting this event again this year as their annual fundraiser. The event, named “Handbags, Health and Happiness” will be hosted on March 19<sup>th</sup>, 2010 in the Community Centre. The Library Board has requested that the Town fees for the use of the Community Centre be waived for March 19<sup>th</sup> for event set up, March 20 for the event and March 21 for clean up. The Library Board has also requested the use of the Town Office Lobby for workshops on Saturday March 20. The library board has agreed to pay for the corkage fee and the Town will be recognized as refreshment sponsor for the event.

Your Administration supports the notion that fees for the event should not be a charge to the fundraising event. The library is recognized as an important service to the community. The event itself is raising money that would be used to directly benefit the library.

In recognition that the Library Board is a function of the Town’s operation, the Administration proposes that the costs associated to host the event form part of the Town’s 2010 Budget. This would mean ensuring that approximately \$800.00 is allocated in the Library Boards Budget to offset the cost of the fundraiser.

Accounting for the fees in this manner, which essentially amounts to waiving the fees for the event, allows the Town to accurately track revenues to the usage in Community Centre account and potentially allows the Library Board to establish the fundraiser as an annual event. From an administrative perspective it would be a simple matter of journal vouchering the actual expense of the event internally from one account to another.

### **Budget Implications**

The Administration, in consultation with the Library Board, would ensure there are sufficient funds in the 2010 Budget to offset an estimated \$800.00 to host "Handbags, Health and Happiness".

### **Conclusion**

The Administration has received a request from the White City Library Board to waive fees associated with the use of the Community Centre for a March 19, 2010 fundraiser event. The event, "Handbags, Health and Happiness" would raise money to be used in support of the operation of the Library. The Administration has determined that the fee waiver would be approximately \$800.00.

The Administration supports the notion that the "Handbags, Health and Happiness" should not be a cost to the fundraising event. It is proposed that the 2010 Budget include sufficient funds to offset the cost of the event.

### **Recommendation**

The Administration recommends that:

1. Council approve the Library Board use of the Community Centre for the "Handbags, Health and Happiness" at no charge to the event; and
2. The Administration ensures there are sufficient in the 2010 Budget to cover the actual Community Centre charges for the "Handbag, Health and Happiness" fundraiser.

Re: Request to Waive Fees – AECOM- Highway No. 1 East Functional Planning Study

### **Background**

In an e-mail dated February 25, 2010, Charlie Billing, Engineer in Training, Transportation, Saskatchewan requested a waiver of Community Centre fees for hosting a workshop. As Mr. Billing stated, White City is a partner in the study, and in such cases the facility rental fees are often waived

The purpose of this report is to seek Council approval for waiving the Community Centre rental fees for January 27 and February 24, 2010.

### **Discussion**

The fees in question are:

Jan. 27, 2010 – Room rental \$189.00

Feb. 25, 2010 – Room rental \$376.00

- The other cost for the Feb. 25 workshop was lunch for a total of \$508.30.
- Set up and tear down for functions like this involve about six hours of labor.
- As a note, we need to set up some policy on waiving rental fees. In this meeting alone we have two requests. Do we waive fees for functions that benefit the town or community? Is the intent of the Community Centre as a revenue source, a facility to serve our community groups? Who has first preference, Community groups or rentals? A policy in place would help in the administration of booking the facilities. In order to implement a policy, background that would be needed is an overview of expenses and revenues. An analysis will be completed for the budgetary process.

## **Budget Implications**

For 2010 there would be a loss of revenue in the amount of \$565.00

## **Conclusion**

The Administration has received a request from Charlie Billing to waive fees associated with the use of the Community Centre for January 27 and February 25, 2010. The Administration has determined that the fee waiver would be \$565.00.

The Administration needs a council decision to waive the Community Centre rental fee of \$565.00. Council needs to explore the need for a policy for Community Centre rentals.

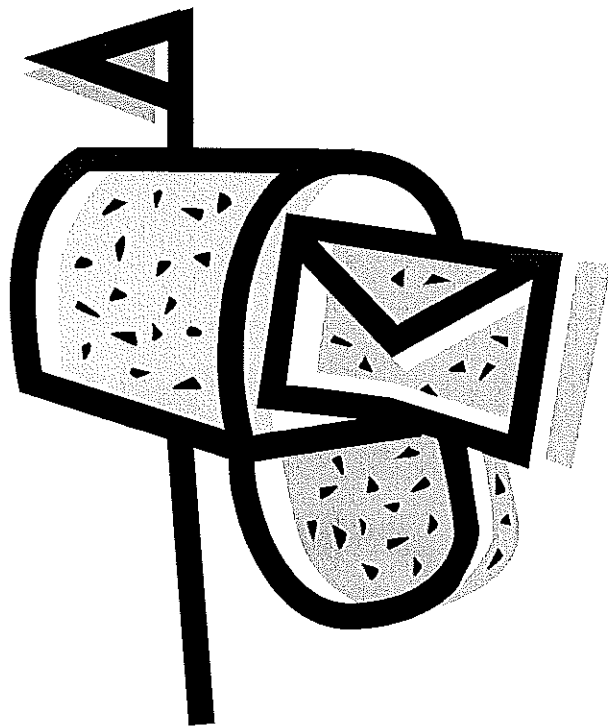
