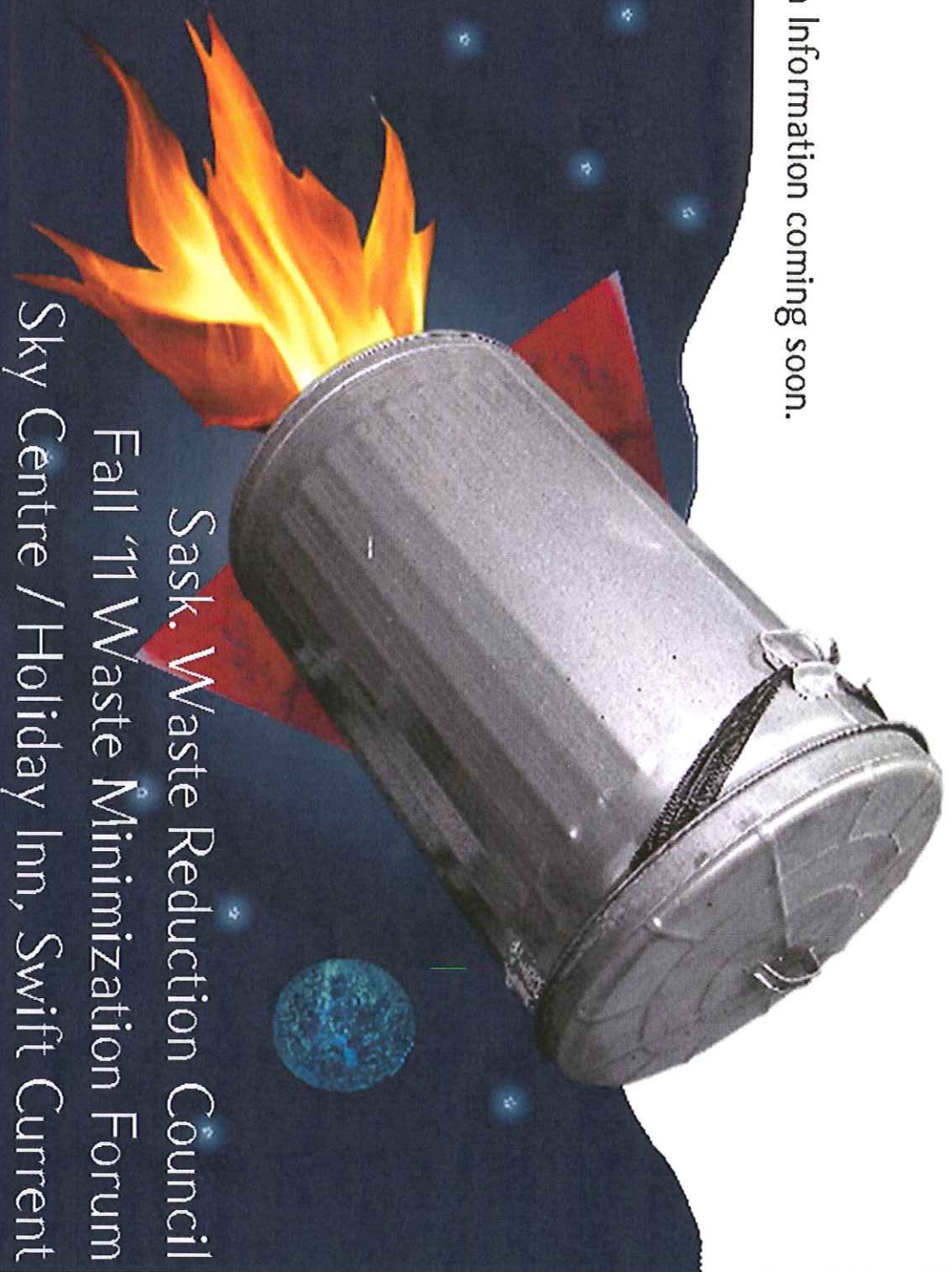

Following up with our previous correspondence and emails regarding the above proposed subdivision, our office has now received comments from most of agencies contacted. However, before we are able to make a final decision this office requires resolution of the following issues:

- As previously mentioned Saskatchewan Environment had concerns with the capacity of the existing lagoon that serves the Town of White City and surrounding areas. No new subdivisions will be approved in the Town of White City until a new sewage lagoon.
- The Town of White City in their letter dated April 28, 2011 indicated the Town is currently undertaking a project to expand the wastewater capacity of their current lagoons. We require confirmation from Saskatchewan Environment once the sewage lagoons have been upgraded and have capacity for this subdivision.
- The proponent must sign a Servicing Agreement with the municipality. This office required a signed copy of the Servicing Agreement and confirmation of settlement of any required fees before we can make a final decision.

Dear Mayor or Reeve:

I am writing to advise you of the 2011 rates for RCMP services for your community.

I can advise there is no change in the per capita rate for 2011. The 2006 population census figures will again be used to calculate the exact cost that will be charged to your municipality for RCMP policing this year. The attached information provides background on the program and rates for 2011.

The RCMP has advised that Detachment Advisory Committees are established throughout the Province. We support and encourage all communities to work closely with their local RCMP detachment members to ensure a satisfactory level of policing services is provided and the overall priorities of the communities within the detachment area are met.

## RCMP COST REDISTRIBUTION PROGRAM - 2011

### *What are the new rates?*

The following table shows the per capita rates that have been set for 2011.

Category	2011 Per Capita Rates
Urban municipalities with RCMP detachments	\$52.45
Urban municipalities without RCMP detachments	\$32.45
All Rural Municipalities	\$32.45

### *Background*

In 2011, the Government will spend approximately \$149.7 million for RCMP policing in Saskatchewan, recovering approximately \$14 million from municipalities through the RCMP Cost Redistribution Program. This program is designed to provide quality cost-effective policing for rural residents and residents of communities with a population of less than 5,000. It is premised on the principle that every municipality contributes to its policing cost.

In 2006, two rates were established, one for municipalities with an RCMP detachment and one for municipalities without a detachment. There is a \$20.00 differential between the two rates. Community leaders have expressed the view that a community with a detachment receives more benefit than a community without a detachment and that rates should be based on that factor.

In 1995, in partnership with representatives from SUMA and SARM, the Government formed the *SUMA/SARM Task Force on Policing and the Administration of Justice*. The formation of the Task Force was a direct result of many municipalities asking for changes in the way police costs were recovered. The method at that time was viewed by many as unfair because urban municipalities with populations over 500 were faced with high policing costs while urban municipalities under 500 and rural municipalities were not required to pay for policing.

The objective of the Task Force was to find an equitable and fair way to allocate RCMP municipal police costs to relieve the financial burden some communities were facing. Over the following three years, the Task Force considered many options and agreed on the formula adopted by the Government in 1999. In establishing the pool, it was understood that the contributions of the participants would pay the entire costs for policing the communities in the pool.

Data from the **2006 population census** will be used to calculate the total cost for RCMP Cost Redistribution in 2010 for each municipality. Even though the per capita rate remains constant this year, the amount of your invoice may be different from your 2010 invoice if a municipality provides administrative support to the local RCMP detachment in accordance with the terms of the Municipal Policing Agreement an individual community has established with the federal government.

The following table shows the impact of the rate change for each category of municipality, including the percentage change for each category and how the cost distribution changes from 2010 to 2011.

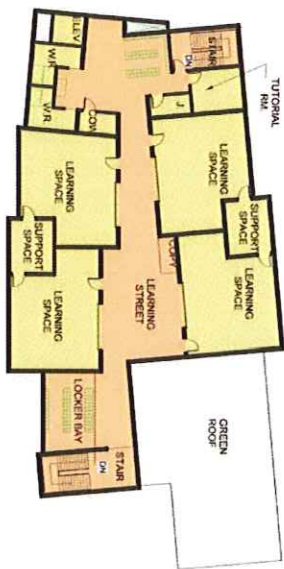
