You may recall we were tasked to prosecute the bylaw offences against Mr. Renneberg arising on March 6 and March 7, 2010. The trial date was fixed, after some confusion, for April 21, 2011, 1:30 p.m. in Bylaw Court, 1815 Smith Street, Regina.

We advise we withdrew the March 7th charges as the sole witness refused to attend and testify. We had spoken to her to discuss her evidence and appear; however Ms. Melnick-Moroz refused to attend.

Mr. Renneberg pled “guilty” to the March 6, 2010 charge. He was fined \$250.00 as per the bylaw.

We wish to point out a problem with the bylaw. In Bylaw 439-05 the charging paragraph is paragraph 4. The fine is set out in Schedule A. Please note the reference in Schedule A to the fines impacted. The Schedule should be revised as follows:

As provided for in Section 18 (not 16)

A) In the case of voluntary payment, within 30 days of infraction:
