Property Tax

Tax notices were sent out June 23 via mail and email. If you haven't received your notice by July 10, please contact or visit the Town Office for assistance.

Tax payments must be received on or before October 31. Starting November 1, an interest penalty of 1.5% will be applied to all remaining unpaid taxes. If paying online, please allow 3-5 business days for the Town to receive the payment.

Don't forget, paying early will save you money! Tax discounts apply as follows to the municipal portion:

- 15% if paid by July 31st
- 13% if paid by August 31st
- 11% if paid by September 30th
- 9% if paid by October 31st

Curbside Waste

Please make sure to label all your curbside waste bins with your address written on a piece of duct tape so wind-blown bins can be reunited with their rightful owner.

Avoid the cost of replacing a missing bin — label it now and save yourself the trouble later!

Weekly Compost Pick-Up

Weekly curbside compost collection is here until October! Loraas will pick up your yard waste and organics every Tuesday, so make sure to put out your compost bin by 7 am. The 2025 collection schedule is available at the Town Office or on our website.

Accepted Items:

- Food scraps
- Unbagged lawn clippings
- Unbagged leaves
- Dryer lint
- Soiled cardboard



Unaccepted Items:

- Packaging
- Fat, grease or other liquids
- Construction waste
- Rocks, dirt or soil
- Tree cuttings thicker than 1' or longer than 2 feet
- Plastic bags or styrofoam

Did you know: residents who are diverting lots of organic materials can get an extra compost bin from the Town for \$5 per month.

Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders

As we gear up for summer, our team is busy working to keep White City looking its best.

Here's what Public Works has on the schedule:

- Road Construction: Crews will be completing pathway and road repairs throughout July. See pages 10-11 for details and watch for updates at whitecity.ca/p/road-closures-construction
- Lift Station: The panel upgrade for Lift Station 6 will be completed in July.
- Solar Lights: Solar lights will be upgraded in Emerald Ridge Park (Squirrel Park) and Churchill Park.
- Emerald Ridge Sports Field: Through a joint project with local community partners, the field will be regraded and receive new top soil, a full irrigation system and fresh sod. The project will begin July 2 and last approximately 30-45 days.

Important Reminders:

- Getting your irrigation system up and running? Take a few minutes to make sure everything's working smoothly—spotting leaks early can keep your lawn happy and save you money on your water bill.
- Please keep all trees and landscaping within your property lines. Planting on municipal land or public reserves is not permitted.
- To prevent the spread of Dutch Elm Disease, do not cut or trim Elm trees between April 1 and August 31.

Double K Rink Update

Rink repairs at Double K are moving along on schedule!

BBK Structural Engineers completed the first site inspection. This included checking the subgrade around the entire rink, cutting the existing piles to the correct height, and removing moisture from inside the piles before concrete forming.

More recently, the grade beams were poured and inspected. Sixteen rink board frames are being shipped to Saskatoon for repairs and galvanization.

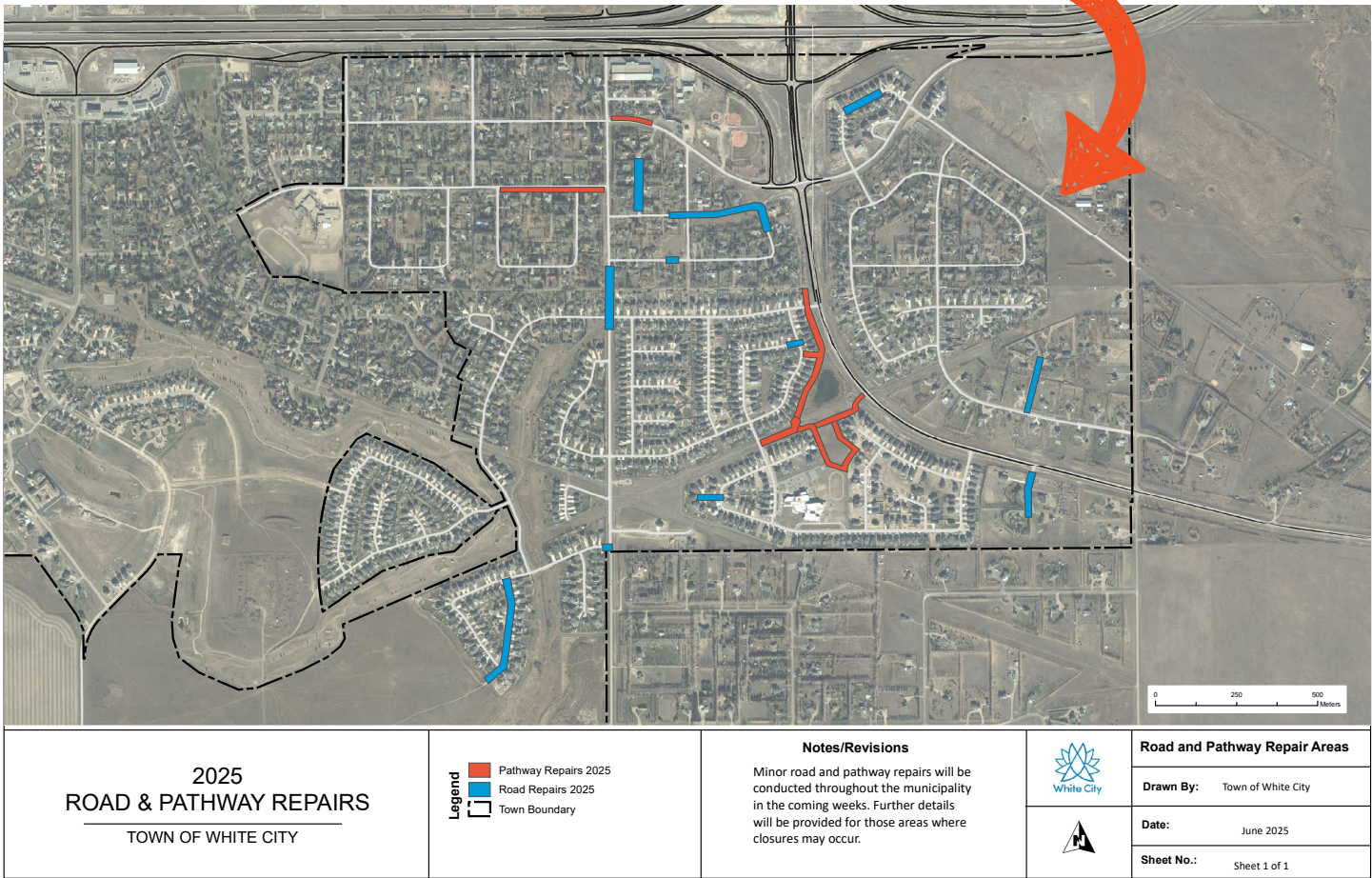
The project is on track to be nearing completion by the end of July.



Summer Pathway & Road Repairs

Heads up! Our Public Works team will be hard at work this summer improving local roads and pathways. Repairs will include slurry sealing, milling and paving, and asphalt capping—all to keep our community safe, smooth, and looking sharp.

Check out the map below to see exactly where crews will be working.



While work is underway, please:

- Watch for posted signs and crews
- Use alternate routes
- Stay off of freshly sealed pathways (your shoes will thank you!)

Work is estimated to take 7-10 days to complete and is tentatively scheduled for mid-July, depending on weather and the contractor’s schedule. Exact dates will be communicated closer to the work commencing.

Special Notice for Emerald Creek Road

Slurry sealing on Emerald Creek Road will be divided into two phases. See the map below for details.

Once the fresh oil is applied, it must dry for 24 hours. During this time, residents will not be able to access the road. Please plan ahead and avoid scheduling deliveries, home service repairs or maintenance during the anticipated construction window.

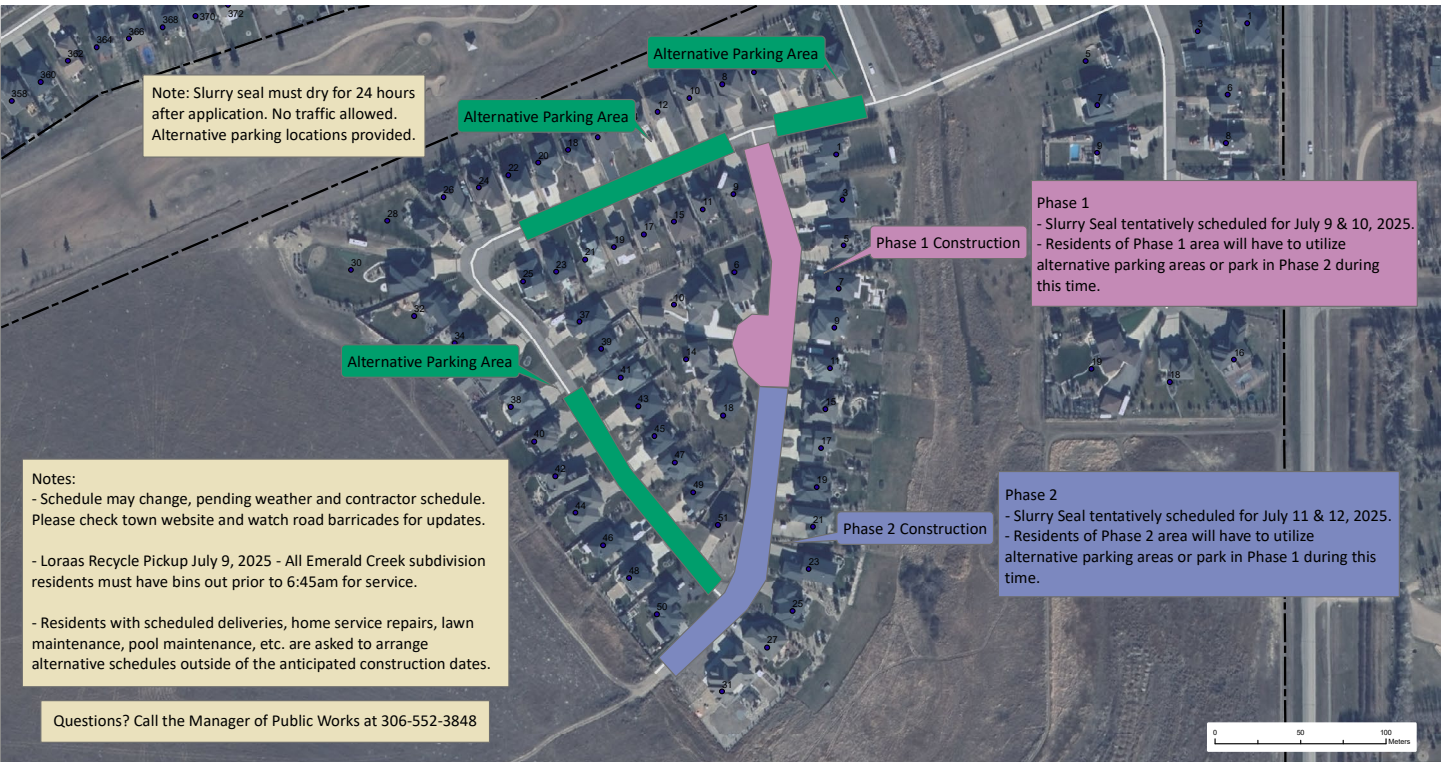
Parking Plan:

Community Safety Reminders

The Community Safety Officer would like to remind residents of the importance of general property upkeep and community standards.

In accordance with the Town's Community Standards Bylaw, all property owners and occupants are responsible for maintaining their premises in a clean, safe, and orderly condition. Properties that are poorly maintained can negatively impact neighbourhood appearance.

Some common examples of bylaw violations include:

- Excessive accumulation of garbage, debris, or construction materials
- Overgrown grass and weeds
- Damaged or inoperable vehicles or RVs stored on property
- Offensive odours or unkempt compost piles
- Untidy storage areas or visible clutter
- Any vegetation or structures interfering with public utilities or traffic safety

Maintaining your property not only keeps the community clean and safe but also supports good relationships with your neighbours. Take a moment to check for any issues that may need attention.
