Welcome back fellow residents of White City (and those reading from the surrounding area) for the October 2024 edition of the White City Councillor Blog. The nomination period for Mayor and Councillor candidates is now open.

As White City continues to grow and evolve, this is your chance to help shape its future. The 2024 Municipal Election is fast approaching, and we are inviting residents to get involved by submitting their nomination papers to run for Mayor or Councillor. Serving on Council is a unique opportunity to represent the voices of our community and help lead the way forward.

Submitting Your Nomination Papers

Nominations will be accepted from September 24, 2024, to October 9, 2024, at the White City Town Office. To submit your nomination, you will need:

- a completed nomination form, signed by five voters of the municipality.
- a Public Disclosure Statement.
- a Criminal Record Check, as required by Bylaw 657-20.

The deadline to submit is October 9, 2024, by 4:00 p.m. If you're considering running, now is the time to gather your materials and complete your paperwork.

Why Consider Running for Council?

Running for Council is an opportunity to make a real difference in our community. Whether you are passionate about community development, local infrastructure, or engaging residents in decision-making, your voice matters. The Town of White City is at a crucial stage of growth, and we need leaders who are ready to guide us into the future.

As a Councillor, you will have a direct role in shaping policies, services, and initiatives that impact every resident. White City's Council is comprised of one Mayor and six Councillors, elected at-large. This means you will represent the entire community, not just a specific ward or district. The term for all positions is four years.

Candidate Information Session

A candidate information session has been tentatively scheduled for Thursday October 17, 2024 from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. This optional in-person session will be available to provide candidates with information on what to expect if they become an elected member. The session will include a high-level overview of time commitment, council and committee process, ethics and other important information.

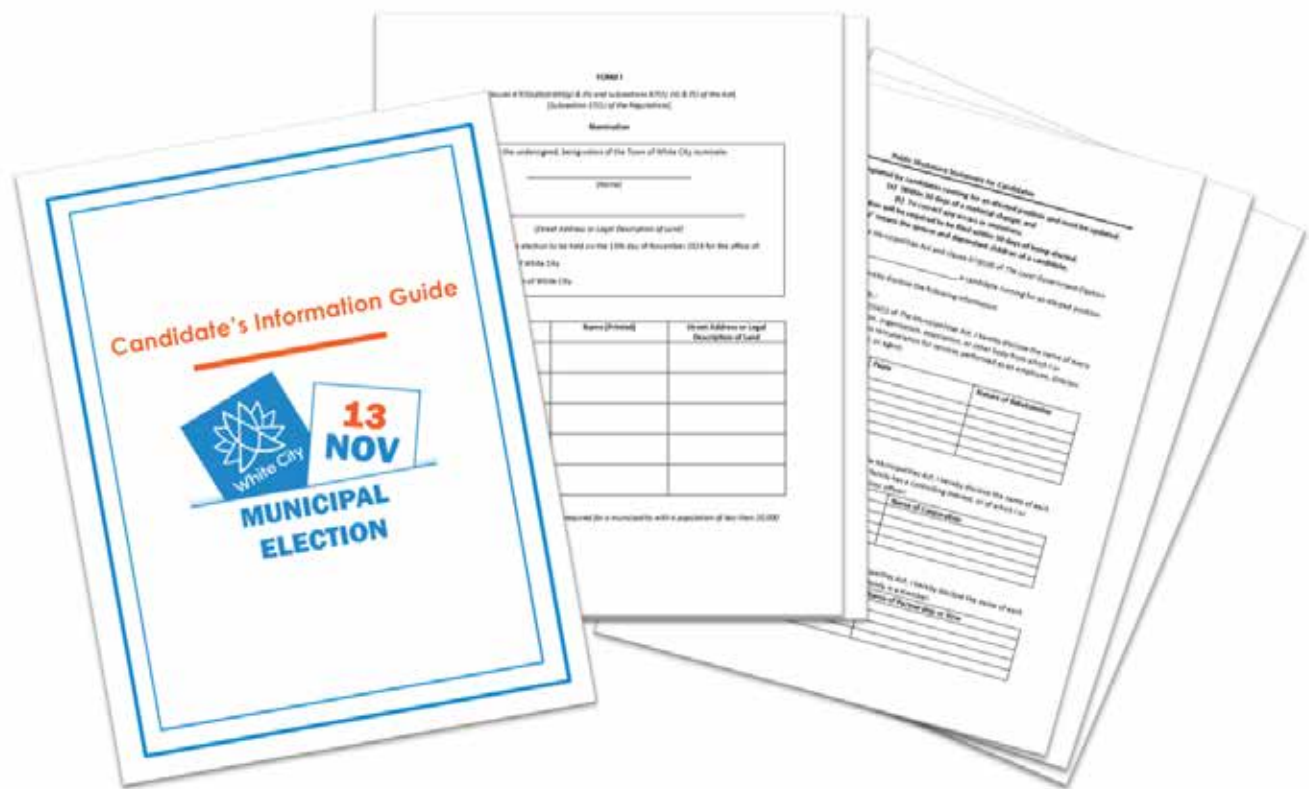

Understanding the Time Commitment

Being a Councillor is a part-time position, but it requires significant dedication. White City Town Council meets bi-weekly on Monday evenings, with additional committee meetings, special sessions, and community events. You should expect to dedicate time for meeting preparation, reviewing reports, and engaging with residents. Council also participates in regional boards and commissions such as the WCRM158 Wastewater Management Authority, Local Library Board and the White Butte Emergency Measures Organization.

For new and returning Councillors, a Council Orientation will be held on November 18 and 19, 2024, to ensure you are prepared to step into your role. Flexibility with your work schedule is essential, as some meetings may take place during daytime hours.

Council Summaries

September 3, 2024 – Committee of the Whole

During the August 19, 2024, Committee of the Whole meeting, key topics included reviews of financial activities, governance, and community planning. The Committee requested clarification on the reimbursement for a residential window damaged during municipal operations and discussed drawing from long-term borrowing for the WCRM158 Wastewater Management Authority Wastewater Expansion Project, finalizing utility rate reviews, and setting timelines for the 2025 Annual Budget. Updates were also provided on the 2024 Municipal Election, school zone safety, and the development of Local Government Student Mock Council Sessions. In community planning, nearly complete pathway projects and ongoing developments in the Town Centre were highlighted.

The Committee recommended adopting a Statutory Holiday Policy after comparing practices with other municipalities. A new Leave of Absence Policy was discussed, including provisions for council and employee leaves, and amendments were suggested to align with provincial minimum requirements. The Committee deferred the Corporate Risk Philosophy and Framework Project Proposal for twelve months and recommended changes to the Fee Bylaw Amendment, excluding court rental fees for further review. During the roundtable, updates included the installation of a timer for court lights, upcoming community events, and the White City Museum’s potential rebranding. The closed session concluded with approval of the Wayfinding Project Plan and a directive to explore collaboration with the RM of Edenwold.

September 16, 2024 – Committee of the Whole

The Committee of the Whole meeting on September 16, 2024, was called to order at 4 PM in Council Chambers. Department reports highlighted updates from Parks, Recreation, and Culture—including a comprehensive fee review, programming plans for 2024 and 2025, facility bookings, and a Summer Play program recap—as well as inquiries regarding vandalism on Town property from the Public Works report. Additionally, the Committee reviewed the Billboard Project proposal, discussing revenue generation, and potential sponsorships and partnerships. The proposal was approved, and it was recommended for consideration in the 2025 Annual Budget.

September 16, 2024 – Regular Council Meeting

The Regular Council Meeting on September 16, 2024, was called to order at 7 PM in Council Chambers. The agenda featured a Consent Agenda that included minutes from the previous meeting and ratification of accounts and payroll. The Town Manager provided a verbal report on recent activities, which was accepted without discussion. Under new business, the Council approved a Leave of Absence Policy, and moved that all future employee benefit or workplace policies will be consolidated into a comprehensive package. The Statutory Holiday Policy was also approved with no further discussion. Additionally, the transition of the Fire Chief position to a volunteer role with an honorarium was approved. In bylaws, Bylaw No. 709-24, the Fee Bylaw Amendment, was adopted after three readings. During the roundtable, updates were provided on the White Butte Emergency Management Organization, the Wastewater Authority facility tour, Chief Schulz’s retirement celebration, and the Royal Park Show Home Parade Grand Opening. The committee entered a closed session discussing proposed plans and policies. Following the closed session, Council passed a resolution to approve the Youth Activity Centre capital project in principle, subject to the Youth Advisory Committee raising the required funds to proceed with the project.

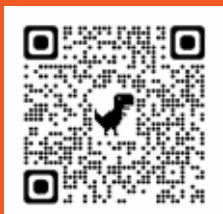

Upcoming Projects

Please keep an eye out for our Public Works team as they work on the following projects, we ask you always use caution around our team and equipment.

- Crack sealing of roads and pathways through October.
- Bower West III Detention Pond revitalization.
- Tree trimming throughout parks, alleys and pathways.
- Fall herbicide application.

As the seasons change Public Works would like to remind residents to:

- Check sewer clean outs to ensure the cap is in place to prevent sewer lines from freezing in winter.
- Check water curb boxes to ensure valves are accessible in case you require an emergency water shut off in winter.
- In preparation of snow clearing, please start placing your garbage, recycling and compost bins on your property and not on the roadway - this allows our plows to efficiently plow snow.

WHITE CITY – FALL CLEAN UP DATES

Clean Up Programs are returning this fall.

Do you have branches, leaves and/or household materials to get rid of? Are you decluttering and cleaning up? Use the following services provided by the Town to help you out:

Leaf Bag Pick Up - October 14 to 25, 2024

NEW For leaf bag pickup service, all bags must be paper bag only. Absolutely no plastic bags will be collected, including those that labelled biodegradable and compostable.

The leaf bag pick up service is community-wide, please have bags neatly piled at the curb area. Town Staff is limited to a 30-minute time limit per property. Please keep bags under 50 lbs. All residents who wish to use the service must have paper leaf bags out at the front property road edge no later than October 21, 2024.

Clean Up Bins - October 23 to 31, 2024

Bins for the community fall cleaning will be at the Splash Park on Lipsett Street for Spring and Fall Clean Up. Depending on the weather, these dates may be subject to change. Please separate your items into the appropriate bins for waste, metal, and recycling. If the bins are full, we ask that you hold on to your items and dispose of them the following business day rather than piling items beside the bins. If you are unsure which bin to use please use the household/mixed waste bins.



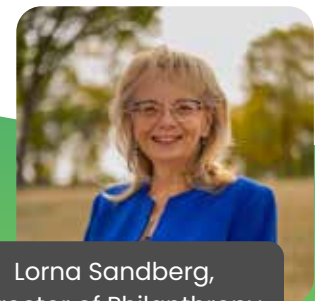
